

Basket-Weave Quilt Top

This quilt is composed of 3 rows. Repeat rows 1 and 2 as many times as desired and sew row 3 to the bottom. For the purpose of this pattern, rows 1 and 2 will be repeated twice to achieve a 45"x45" quilt top. Be creative and have fun with colors; black, white and gray are used here just to keep it simple.

- All seams are ½"

Pieces:

1. 7"x7" – cut 16 in black
2. 5"x7" – cut 10 in white
3. 5"x11" – cut 6 in gray
4. 5"x17" – cut 7 in gray
5. 5"x11" – cut 10 in white
6. 5"x5" – cut 2 in white

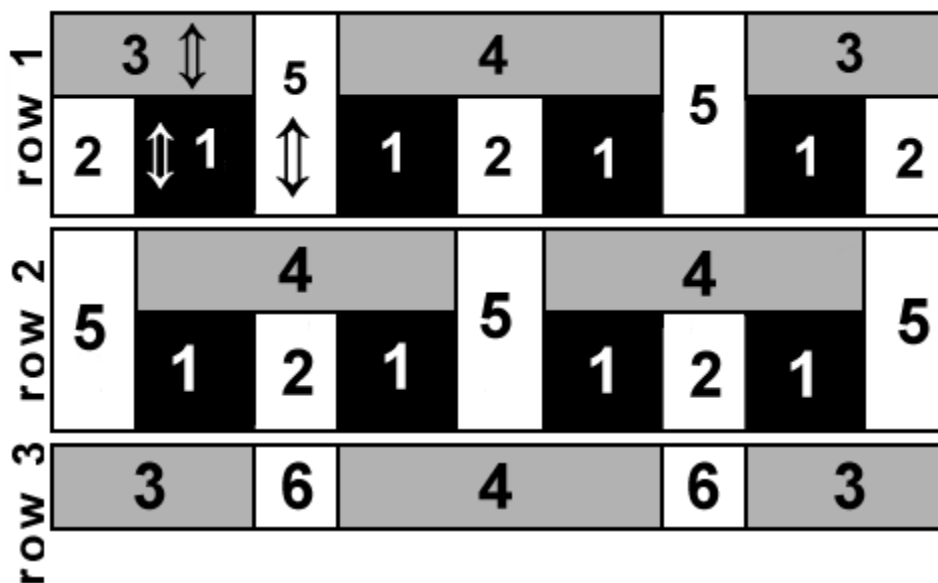
Materials:

Black fabric- 2/3 yard of 45" wide fabric
 White fabric- 3/4 yard of 45" wide fabric
 Gray fabric- 1 yard of 45" wide fabric
 Batting- 1½ yards of 45" wide batting
 Quilt back- 1½ yards of 45" wide fabric
 Baby yarn

Please note: The grain of the fabric should be in the same direction when quilt is completed. Refer to the arrows on the picture below. They should be parallel to the grain of the fabric.

Row 1: Use the picture below to help you visualize. (Make 2)

1. Sew piece 2 to the left side of piece 1. Sew piece 3 to the top of this. Set aside.
2. Sew piece 2 to the right side of piece 1. Sew piece 3 to the top of this. Set aside.
3. Sew a piece 1 to each side of piece 2. Sew piece 4 to the top of this.
4. Sew a piece 5 to each side of the combination from step 3.
5. Sew step 1 to the left side of step 4.
6. Sew step 2 to the right side of step 5.



Row 2: Use the picture on the previous page to help you visualize. (Make 2)

1. Sew a piece 1 to each side of piece 2. Do this twice.
2. Sew a piece 4 to the top of each of these.
3. Sew a piece 5 to the left of each of the pieces from step 2.
4. Sew the two pieces from step 3 together.
5. Sew piece 5 to the end of the piece from step 4.

Row 3: Use the picture on the previous page to help you visualize.

1. Sew piece 3 to the left of piece 6.
2. Sew step 1 to the left of piece 4.
3. Sew step 2 to the left of piece 6.
4. Sew step 3 to the left of piece 3.

Assemble:

1. You should now have two of Row 1 and two of Row 2. Sew Row 1 to Row 2 to Row 1 to Row 2.
2. Sew Row 3 to the bottom of these four rows.
3. Attach back and batting as desired.
4. Using baby yarn, tie the corners of the squares to the backing.
